About De Grey Mining

De Grey Mining Limited (ASX: DEG) is a West Australian gold explorer and project developer which has made one of Australia's most exciting new gold discoveries at Hemi.

De Grey listed on the ASX in 2002 as a multicommodity explorer and has had a presence in the West Australian Pilbara region since inception.

Our activities are focussed on the 100% owned Hemi Gold Project within the Mallina Gold Province, located approximately 85km south of Port Hedland. The Mallina Gold Province spans approximately 150km across Kariyarra, Ngarluma, Nyamal, Ngarla and Mallina Country.

The Hemi Gold Project is rapidly moving towards our goal of defining a Tier 1 project with true district-scale potential. Mineralisation in the Hemi area has been identified with a Mineral Resource Estimate of 10.6 million ounces. The discovery remains open in multiple directions.

As our project develops, we intend to employ local people and work with local businesses. We are expecting to create approximately 900 jobs during the construction phase and 600 jobs once operational.

COVID-19 RESPONSE IN THE PILBARA

As the world continued to be impacted by COVID-19, De Grey remained vigilant in our approach to protecting our people and supporting the local Port Hedland community.

With a strict COVID-19 testing regime and vaccinations being compulsory, we were able to achieve significant milestones, including a Pre-Feasibility Study on the Hemi Gold Project, whilst ensuring the ongoing safety and wellbeing of our people.

During the pandemic, we also:

- Donated rapid antigen test kits to Ashburton Aboriginal Corporation (AAC) to help job seekers across AAC's community development program.
- Donated food packs to Kariyarra Aboriginal Corporation members to help through isolation periods.

CASE STUDY

CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE

This year we expanded our Containers for Change program, which is now operating across all three site locations.

The Containers for Change initiative encourages sustainable practices and allows us to support local Port Hedland not- forprofit organisations by donating the funds raised from our containers.

To date, De Grey has raised \$2,473 through Containers for Change and donated funds to various local organisations. That's 24,730 containers that have been saved from landfill and recycled into everyday items.



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Native Title and Heritage

We seek to create meaningful, ongoing relationships that respect local and regional cultures.

At De Grey, we work closely with Traditional Owners to facilitate cultural heritage surveys which provides our people an important opportunity to learn more about the significance of cultural heritage in the Pilbara.

Facilitating meaningful relationships with Traditional Owners and learning more about the location we operate in helps us to ensure we are able to protect sites of cultural significance in partnership with local knowledge holders. De Grey is committed to the protection of significant Aboriginal and historic cultural heritage sites. We are currently developing a Cultural Heritage Management Plan (CHMP) with the Kariyarra Aboriginal Corporation (KAC), which will guide the management of heritage sites in the project area, and create robust protocols for managing matters of cultural significance.



YINTHA NGURRARA (KNOWLEDGE HOLDERS) MEETING

In partnership with KAC, De Grey held an on Country meeting with Kariyarra elders and local knowledge holders.

The group visited the proposed location of the Hemi Gold Project to gain a deeper understanding of its potential impacts on country.

At De Grey, we work hard to ensure we build strong, positive relationships based on trust and transparency with Aboriginal communities where we have a presence.

We will continue to work with Traditional Owners of the lands on which we operate to identify and protect cultural heritage areas of significance.

De Grey and KAC are in the final stages of negotiating a Native Title Mining Agreement.









Sustainability

We are committed to operating ethically, sustainably, and in accordance with best governance practices.

We believe that responsible management of environmental, social and governance (ESG) elements are critical to success when working with communities.

Accordingly, we are committed to identifying, assessing and mitigating risks and proactively seeking pathways that deliver positive and sustainable outcomes.

As we advance the Hemi discovery, environmental, heritage, social and governance considerations will be embedded across all our decision making. We aim to deliver responsible practices that lead to shared value for all stakeholders.

De Grey has aligned with the International Council of Mining and Metals (ICMM) and is committed to implementing the ICMM principles. The Board has also resolved to adhere to the Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosures.

Hemi has the potential to be one of the lowest carbon intensive gold projects in Australia. This will be achieved through the use of renewable energy sources emerging in the Pilbara and the transition of the mobile equipment fleet from diesel to electric.
